WHEREAS, the City of Conway is in need of additional land for a landfill site and a borrow area for fill material for the current site; and


WHEREAS, the Conway City Council has option to buy 70 acres of land adjacent to the existing landfill site.

That the 1985 budget is hereby amended to appropriate \$110,000 to purchase the 70 acres under option.



Dear Mayor Wright:

I am writing in regards to the geotechnical report for the property west of the present landfill. According to the report the property contains a substantial amount of suitable quality clay soil which could be used at the present landfill. As you are aware, the Department is concerned about the chronic problems noted at the landfill. Prior to approving this acreage for use as a borrow area a remedial action plan and time table must be developed. This plan should include the following:

- 1) A map delineating the borrow area and calculations on the amount of usable material available and the amount required to reach the designed finished grade.
- 2) A plan for revegetating the entire site except for a small working face. This plan should include the stabilization of the east and west slopes with final cover, terraces, mulch and seeding. Specific vegetation type as well as planting schedule and seed bed preparation should be provided.
- 3) Also a sedimentation pond with an adequate retention time should be constructed to receive runoff from the borrow area as well as the landfill.

It was also understood at our October 17, 1985 meeting that the property is generally not recommended for further solid waste permit pursual. However, it was also understood that a small acreage (5-10 acres) adjacent to the existing landfill could be favorably considered for landfill expansion within the next five (5) years.
