# RESOLUTION ENDORSING WES CON TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ARKANSAS ENTERPRISE ZONE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Conway has received approval by the Arkansas Industrial Development Commission designating Census Tract 9903, Block Group 1, as expanded, in the City as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, Jerry Spradlin, d/b/a Wes Con/ a local business located within the boundaries of the aforementioned Enterprise Zone, has applied to the City seeking endorsement to participate in the Enterprise Zone program; and

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the request of the business and determined that it meets all requirements of the Arkansas Enterprise Zone Program.

Dear Mr. Adams:

Last August, the City of Conway was approached by Wes Con Machining, a local business owned by Mr. Jerry Spradlin which was planning to expand their operation and construct a new building in the new Conway Industrial Park, a site within our Enterprise Zone, Census Tract 9903, Block Group 1 (Expanded).

Evidently, there was a miscommunication between the City and Mr. Spradlin concerning Wes Con's Enterprise Zone endorsement resolution. Mr. Spradlin purchased the site from the Conway Industrial Park on July 6, 1990, in part due to the potential benefits of the Enterprise Zone program. If there had been no miscommunication, the Conway City Council would have passed the Resolution of Endorsement for Wes Con at its meeting on August 14, 1990. Upon discovery of this error, the Council passed a proper Enterprise Zone endorsement resolution on June 11, 1991.

I have enclosed a copy of this resolution, along with the Enterprise Zone application for Wes Con.

The City hopes that you and Mr. Harrington can rectify this apparent hardship to Wes Con and Mr. Spradlin, which seems to have been caused by a miscommunication, approving this Enterprise Zone application with an effective date of August 14, 1990.

Dear Mayor:

As you may recall from our telephone conversation, Mr. Jerry Spradlin of Wes Con Machining purchased a site in the "new" industrial park east of I-40 last year, and constructed a new facility for his company. He had been told by Jim Brewer and Guy Murphy about the Enterprise Zone program, and these incentives made his decision to proceed with this ambitious project more feasible.

Somewhere along the way, there was a miscommunication, and Mr. Spradlin failed to request the appropriate endorsement resolution from the City. I have spoken to Windell Adams, Special Assistant to Dave Harrington, the AIDC director, who stated that to give Wes Con a retroactive eligibility date, an "official" explanation from the City would be necessary, establishing the date that the resolution would have been passed if none of these problems had taken place. Based on my understanding, the application should have been sent to you by August 1, 1990, which would have allowed the City Council to have considered a resolution on its meeting of August 14, 1991.

I have enclosed an endorsement resolution for consideration at next week's Council meeting, as well as a draft letter for your signature which explains this matter to Mr. Adams. Please feel free to change or edit this letter as you see fit. Mr. Spradlin will be bringing you the application for Wes Con, which should be forwarded by the City to AIDC with the resolution and your letter.

In order to receive Enterprise Zone tax credits, AIDC strongly encourages hiring through the local Arkansas Employment Security Division. The business must certify (and verify after hiring) that at least 35% of its net new employees meet the criteria set forth in Section 4.02.02 and 4.04.03 of the Arkansas Enterprise Zone Program Regulations.

In proceeding with employment, remember that 35% of all new employees must be (a) residents of the same county as the location of the business or counties adjacent thereto; and (b) have been receiving some form of public assistance immediately prior to employment; or are considered unemployable by traditional standards or lacking in basic skills at the time of employment.

Public assistance means any contribution, monetary or otherwise, made by federal, state, county, and/or local governments to individuals who qualify therefor by reason of indigence and/or unemployment, as determined by the applicable rules, regulations, or guidelines, of each public assistance program (e.g., unemployment insurance compensation, Section 8 housing payments, Social Security, etc.)

Employees considered unemployable by traditional standards should have met items 2, 3, and 4 of those listed below. A person would qualify as lacking in basic skills should meet criteria 1, 3, and 4 of the following items:

- (1) Be required to participate in a company training program; or
- (2) Been unemployed for at least 13 weeks prior to employment with the company;
- (3) Should not have quit last employer without good cause to gain employment with the company; and
- (4) Have registered with either the Arkansas Employment Security Division or a private employment agency and not have turned down any job offers.
